
# MR. MUSLEH's NEWS







# Rig support leg traps finger

During rigging-up the work floor, the support legs were being lifted by winch using a tugger line. The Derrick man was guiding the tugger line with his left hand. As the support leg was moved, it dropped slightly crushing his finger against the cat walk resulting in a fracture of the tip of his finger.









### Technician breaks arm

After completing rigging down the top section of the scaffolding, a technician began removing a plank (1m section of scaffolding grating). When he tried to push the plank up with the hammer and his hands, he slipped and fell on to the xmas tree and hit his hand against the xmas tree suffering a fracture to his upper right arm.







## Shortcut leads to dislocated knee

While trying to fill the hoist diesel tank from a diesel drum on a forklift forks the mechanic climbed over the barrier standing with one foot on the forks and the other on the hoist. As he tried to roll the drum he felt dizzy and fell 1.2m to the ground dislocating his right knee.
