ARE YOU AWARE OF THE LINE OF FIRE RISKS IN YOUR AREA

TARGET AUDIENCE

Supervisors, Worker, riggers, permit holders and equipment operators

WHAT HAPPENED & WHY

- Crew was loading three spools to the HIAB truck using telescopic forklift
- Rigger pushed the spool on HIAB bed
- Spool fell and hit a wooden piece on HIAB bed
- Wooden piece bounced towards the rigger face and hit him close to his left eye

ENGAGEMENT QUESTIONS

- How do team members ensure they are aware of their roles and responsibilities during operations?
- In what ways do you feel comfortable giving and receiving feedback about safety practices and operational procedures?
- How are the Life-Saving Rules applied during various activities, and what impact do they have?
- What is the atmosphere of trust and open communication like among frontline workers and between workers and supervisors?
- How do personnel feel about sharing concerns related to safety and operational hazards?
- What strategies can we use to encourage open communication and honest dialogue, allowing team members to voice concerns or challenges faced during operations?
- How does your team utilize STEP7 and Start Work Check in their daily activities?

INSIGHTS

- Improper Handling of Load: The pipe spool was pushed manually, which led to it hitting a wooden piece that bounced and hit the worker.
- Inadequate Risk Assessment: The crew didn't pause to assess the risk of loading using forklift and HIAB and The potential for workers to be in line of fire was not anticipated.
- Develop a detailed lifting plan that includes the sequence of operations, roles and responsibilities

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KEY TAKEAWAYS

- While the Permit to Work (PTW) system is an important safety tool, it is our individual behaviors that truly make a difference in ensuring our safety on the jobs.
- Always stay vigilant and aware of the line of fire in your area. It's essential for your safety and the safety of your colleagues..
- Make it a habit to utilize the STEP 7 process before you start any task and when there is any changes. This helps us confirm that we have taken all necessary precautions.
- If there's ever a change in the work plan, don't hesitate to pause. Take a moment to reassess the situation and ensure that all safety measures are still being followed.
